Share prayer requests with the small group. Ask someone to take notes and share the requests with group members after the meeting.

4. What do you understand propitiation to mean? Consider the "Day of Atonement" in the Old Testament. Have someone read Leviticus 16:34. Discuss as a group the similarities between atonement and propitiation.
