AUTHOR'S NOTES (summary of key points for this study)

3. What all do you pick up about about Caleb from Joshua 15:13-19?

4. How was it possible for Caleb to get the best out of others in taking the land of Kiriath Sepher?

5. How do you think Othniel felt about being a son-in-law to Caleb? How does Judges 3:7-11 describe their relationship? How does he live up to his indirect inheritance?

6. What do you think Caleb learns from his special method of identifying who would be a good husband to his daughter?

7. What else might Caleb hope to accomplish by making this offer?

8. How does Achsah take great care in making an offer to her dad? How is she like her dad?

9. What was so unusual about the request made by the daughters of Zelophehad?

10. Why did Joshua grant them their request?

11. What can you learn from the daughters of Zelophehad?

12. How else does God look after and honor women in the Old Testament and New Testament in a way very distinct from the cultural norms of false religions like Islam today?

13. If you have fathers or would-be dads in your group, how can they protect and honor the daughters in their household?
