GETTING STARTED

Choose one of the following discussion starters:

- What is your favorite love song or rock ballad? Why?
- What are some current cultural issues that tend to stir up passion rather than apathy?

Read Revelation 2:1-7.

I AM . . .

Lord of the church. In Revelation 2:1 Jesus says, "To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: 'The words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands.'" In short, Jesus is declaring that he holds the seven churches. He is the sustainer and protector. He is in control. What a way to introduce himself in these letters!

I SAY . . .

- Remember: Take a moment to share your conversion experience. What fostered your "first love" with Christ?
- Repent: As a group, read 1 John 1:8-10 and James 5:16. What do these passages say about our confession to God and others? How might we respond?
- Do: What were some of the things that initially stirred your passion for Christ? Which of these can you return to today?

I WILL . . .
